Staggered starts and ends to the day

Start of day- all children:

For children currently arriving at 9.00am, please could you arrive by 8.55am **at the latest.**

End of day:

Nursery, reception and KS1 - children

For those that usually pick up at 3.00pm – please pick up at 3.05pm

KS2

For those that usually pick up at 3.00pm – please pick up at 3.10pm.

For those that usually pick up at 3.15 – please pick up at 3.20pm.

The end of the day is particularly important to get right, to avoid large groups of parents gathering in one place at the same time.

Covid-19

In Hertfordshire, but not Bengeo school, there have sadly been some incidents reported where people have not followed Government guidance on self-isolation and knowingly attended school whilst symptomatic or have been living with someone who is symptomatic or that has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19).

Hertfordshire County Council have acknowledged that, although incidents such as this are rare, the impact this has on our bubble systems and the safety of other students and staff is wide reaching. HCC have asked us to remind parents and carers that, to knowingly ignore the self-isolation guidance is breaking the law, and you could be fined £1000. Google Classroom

Many thanks to those of you in KS2 who have logged on to Google classroom and turned in some work. This has helped us to identify which children have been able to access the system. For those children who have not yet turned in any work, your class

teacher will contact you to check that there are no problems and that you can access to the system.

For children in KS1 and reception, please look out for an activity which will be set today, this needs to be turned in as soon as possible so that we can monitor who is accessing the system.

Please could we ask you to continue to check weekly to see if there are any messages from your child's teacher as, in the event of local lockdown, this will be the way in which we continue to teach your child/ren.

For children who are absent, teachers will endeavour to set some work, but there will be a delay in getting this to you, as they will be working with the rest of the class during the day. Ordinarily work will only be set for children who are off for long periods of time, due to absence related to Covid-19.

Please note teachers are unable to respond to any messages from parents sent in through google classroom. This system is used as a teaching tool only, and teachers are not notified of messages when they are posted. If you have any concerns, please email in to the school office who will forward your message to the relevant teacher.

If we have not heard from you by 9:15am, you will receive a message/call from our Attendance Coordinator, Mrs Ogier, to enquire as to why your child is absent.

Unauthorised absences over 15 sessions, which equates to 7 full days and one half day, per academic year, may result in a penalty notice.
