

Fire and Evacuation

If the fire alarm sounds, leave the building by the nearest exit and proceed to the assembly point. The assembly point is:

Do not leave site and do not re-enter the building until you are told it is safe to do so.

Smoking

Smoking is not permitted anywhere on the site.

Mobile Phones

- Mobile phones are not to be used within the school premises.
- If you need to use your phone for an emergency please speak to a member of staff.
- If a visitor, parent or carer is seen using their mobile phone, they will be asked politely to turn it off.

Site Safety

If you identify a H&S issue whilst on site please notify a member of staff.

Your safety and well-being during your visit is important to us. As a visitor you have a legal duty of care for the Health and Safety of yourself and others.

First Aid and Accidents

If you require first aid or you feel unwell then please notify a member of staff who will fetch a first aider to assist you.

Any incidents of illness, injury or accident must be reported to the school office.

Child Protection Advice

As a school we are committed to safeguarding and meeting the needs of children and we hope this leaflet will provide some useful advice and information when working with children at Bengoe Primary School.

What should I do if I am worried about a child? If whilst working with a child you become concerned about:

- Comments made by a child
- Marks or bruising on a child
- Changes in the child's behaviour or demeanour

It is important to remember that it is not your responsibility to investigate suspected cases of abuse but you MUST report them to the designated safeguarding leads (DSL's) as soon as possible.

If your concern is about a member of staff or volunteer you should report this to the Headteacher. If your concern is about the Headteacher, you should report this to the Chair of Governors.
